British Cars Embark On Wrightsville Beach

Motor Club Meets At Seapath

Seapath Yacht Club's parking lot was packed with cars on Saturday – cars that may look more at home in London than at Wrightsville Beach.

The British Motor Club of the Cape Fear (BMCCF) kicked off the year with a potluck covered dish social at Seapath.

"It was cold outside," said member Edie Cutler. "But we had a good time."

The BMCCF currently has 124 members with 92 cars. The vehicles range from Jaguars to Aston Martins.

John Foster, a resident of the club, said about 55 people came to the event at Seapath. "It was our first outing there," he said.


The club began eight years ago as a way for British car lovers to get together, Foster explained. "It was formed for the camaraderie of owning a British mark car," Foster said. "The expertise of people in the club about part sources, repairs and general upkeep about the vehicle is also valuable."

Some of the unique cars include a 1958 MGA, a 1951 Bentley, a 1948 MG TD and a 2004 Mini-Cooper S, Foster said.

"They don't have to be old cars," he said. "What we sort of lean towards are cars by a British manufacturer. We don't discriminate. We have people with non-British cars."

The group also holds various social functions throughout the year, including garage tours of members' houses and trips to Beaufort.

"We enjoy each other's company," Foster said.

North Carolina Bill to Reduce Historic-Vehicle Registration Fees: SEMA is supporting North Carolina legislation, H.B. 2665, to reduce the annual registration fees for historic vehicles to \$10, plus a one-time additional fee of \$10 for a historic license plate. Currently, historic-vehicle owners must pay the regular annual registration fee of \$20 plus the \$10 historic-plate fee, thereby creating a disadvantage to register historic vehicles.

Consequently, many qualified vehicles are not registered as historic, and owners do not take advantage of the opportunity to pay reduced taxes-an option available to historic vehicles. Under current North Carolina law, historic plates can be issued for a motor vehicle that is at least 35 years old. Vehicles registered under this class must be maintained primarily for use in exhibitions, club activities, parades and other public interest functions and only occasionally for other purposes.

The setting for the show was perfect, with the historic waterfront of Wilmington across the river and the battleship serving as the backdrop. The weather was also perfect with bright sunshine and a slight breeze quickly dispatching the chilly morning temperatures.

Long-time Carolinas club members, Bill and Gail Massey offered to host members making the four hour trek across the state and temporary bachelors, Chuck Reeves and Dick Lunney took them up on their offer as they were hoping to find some "*Desperate Housewives*" as their wives had left them alone to travel to Boston and Cleveland respectively. Fortunately for everyone, the boys stayed busy with car activities that included a Friday evening dinner with the BMCCF members and other out of town registrants including a bunch from Charlotte's Metro-lina MG Car Club at Fat Tony's restaurant on the Wilmington waterfront.
